Position Summary:

The Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology (MS-SLP) program at Oklahoma Baptist University (OBU) prepares competent and professional service-minded leaders in speech-language pathology who integrate Christian principles and values into the prevention, assessment, and treatment of communication and swallowing disorders across the lifespan. The OBU MS-SLP program invites applications for adjunct faculty to teach academic courses.

Adjunct faculty play a vital role in supporting the mission of the program by providing high-quality instruction, engaging students in meaningful learning, and modeling the integration of the Christian faith with the profession of speech-language pathology. The ideal candidate demonstrates teaching excellence, innovation, flexibility, professionalism, and a collaborative attitude. *Adjunct positions for academic courses are eligible for remote work. Travel to the OBU campus is not required.*

Hiring Timeline: This position will remain open until it is filled.

Qualifications:

- Master's degree in Speech-Language Pathology and current ASHA CCC-SLP required; doctorate (PhD or EdD) preferred. Strong candidates with a clinical doctorate (SLPD, ClinSciD) will also be considered.

- 4. Strong organizational, teaching, and communication skills.

Must be an active member of an evangelical* church in one's community of residence, willing to teach in accordance with the Baptist Faith & Message 2000, and in agreement with the university's policy on human sexuality (provided by HR upon request). *Evangelical is a broad term referring to a segment within Christianity which maintains the authority of the Bible and the belief in salvation by faith in Jesus alone.

Responsibilities:

- Teach assigned academic courses in the MS-SLP program (course assignments may vary by semester).
- Prepare and deliver engaging course content aligned with program and accreditation standards.
- Provide timely, constructive feedback and support to students.
- Collaborate with faculty and staff to ensure a positive student experience.
- Participate in professional development opportunities and/or faculty meetings/trainings as appropriate.

Required application documents:

- online application, current curriculum vitae, reference contact information, official transcripts
- cover letter that describes how your expertise and experience will positively contribute to the program's mission and goals
- Statement of faith (500 word maximum) that addresses the following:
 - Personal faith journey
 - o Integration of faith and professional life
 - o Commitment to and value of Christian higher education
 - Alignment with the OBU mission and vision
 - Description of how you teach and model the relation between the Christian worldview and your academic discipline.
- Teaching statement (500 word maximum) that addresses the following:
 - Approach to teaching and learning
 - Summary of teaching experience
 - Commitment to lifelong learning
 - Specific examples of effectiveness as an instructor
 - Foundational values that guide how you foster student engagement, evaluate student learning, and pursue ongoing professional growth.
